WE PAY TRIBUTE TO LYNNE LLEWELYN

With much sadness our beloved piano teacher, Lynne Llewelyn passed away in John Hunter Hospital on Tuesday 9 November surrounded by her family. She was 56 years of age. Lynne was the loving wife of Max and mother to Emma, Sarah and John.

Lynne was employed by the Upper Hunter Conservatorium of music in 2001. She quickly established a reputation as a caring and nurturing teacher. Lynne became fully involved in the performing arts in Muswellbrook. She was a regular accompanist for countless children performing in the Muswellbrook and Upper Hunter

Eisteddfod and AMEB examinations. Lynne was also the rehearsal pianist for the Muswellbrook Amateur Theatrical Society, their most recent production being, The Sound of Music. Lynne was also a member of the music team at Brookside Baptist Church Muswellbrook where she played the piano.

During her career, Lynne expanded her musical abilities by learning the Saxophone and the Pipe Organ. She played Saxophone in the Muswellbrook Shire Concert Band and the Pipe Organ for services at St Alban's Anglican Church. Lynne will be sadly missed by her students from her Campbell's Corner studio and the seven Upper Hunter Schools where she taught piano on a weekly basis.

A condolence book is available in Studio 2 at the Upper Hunter Conservatorium of Music to receive messages from students and friends. This room will be a place of quiet reflection for parents and children until the end of 2016.

A funeral service will be held at St Alban's Anglican Church on Tuesday 15 November at 11:00am. To be followed by a wake at the Upper Hunter Conservatorium of Music.
