BEACH TO BUSH

Last Tuesday Surf Life Saving NSW came to our school to present a "Beach to Bush" Surf Safety Education program. The program began as a result of research which highlighted that 50% of people rescued from the surf live more than 50km from the beach. The children learnt the importance of swimming between the red and yellow flags, how to identify rips, how to signal for help while in the water and the meaning of different signs found at a beach.

WATER SAFETY - LEARNING IN ACTION

On the weekend we went to Forster to visit our Nan. We went to the beach. Atticus was playing in the shallow water but the water dropped off into a big hole and there was a rip or washing machine and Atticus got stuck in it and couldn't get out.

I tried to reach out to him and I couldn't. I jumped in from the side and had to push him up because he was going under the water. I then had to push him out of the whirlpool while swimming out myself. I remembered from our Beach to Bush session not to push against the tide and the dark areas of the rip. We both got out safely and everyone's legs were shaking. Nan lost her shoes when she was starting to go into the water after us. We have both learnt not to go in rips and not to swim against it if you do get stuck in one and don't panic. It was really scary and I didn't realise how frightening it was until I got out of the water and saw all the adults standing on the beach. Atticus said he is not keen on going to the beach anytime soon. He will stick to the pool.

purchase those items on your behalf for someone in need. You get a card giving details about the item, which you can send to your friend or family member telling them that it has been bought on their behalf. You also get a tax deductable receipt.

You may like to consider fundraising as a group and working towards one of the larger gifts E.g. a well or health worker or community school class
