### BE PREPARED FOR PUBLIC SPEAKING

All students in K-6 will be expected to prepare and present a speech to their class in **Week 5**, 23 – 27 May. The students will need to prepare their speeches at home, but are encouraged to seek advice from their class teacher. There are four categories for the competition Early Stage One, Stage One, Stage 2 and Stage 3.

Speaking times are; **Early Stage 1**; 1:00 – 1:30mins, **Stage 1**; 1:30 – 2:00mins, **Stage 2**; 2:30mins – 3:00mins and **Stage 3**; 3:30mins – 4:00mins.

Three students from each class will be chosen to go through to the **Stage semi-final in Week 6**. Students who placed first in their Year in this Stage semi-final will be invited to give their speech at the **Muswellbrook and Upper Hunter Eisteddfod on Wednesday 8th June at 5pm**. The school grand final will be held in **Week 8**, where the three top speakers in each Year will repeat their speech, competing against others in their Stage.

Please remember the students are not to use any props except their palm cards.

The grand final dates are as follows; the chosen Kindergarten to Year 2 students will present their prepared speeches to the school on **Tuesday 14 June**. Year 3 to Year 6 students will be asked to present both their prepared and impromptu speeches on **Wednesday 15 June**. In the impromptu section students will be given a topic and 5 minutes to prepare their speech. Parents, friends and relatives are most welcome to attend.

### YEAR 5 ENTRY TO AN OPPORTUNITY CLASS

Parents wishing to apply for Year 5 entry to an opportunity class in 2017, please be advised applications are now open.

Opportunity classes cater for highly achieving academically gifted students who may otherwise be without classmates at their own academic and social level. These schools help gifted and talented students to learn by grouping them with other gifted and talented students, teaching them in specialised ways and providing educational materials at the appropriate level.

Applications for opportunity class placement are considered mainly on the basis of the Opportunity Class Placement Test results and school assessment scores. The Opportunity Class Placement Test will be held on **Wednesday 27 July 2016**. Please note that there are no opportunity classes in the Upper Hunter. The nearest classes to Scone are at Cessnock West Public School, Jewells Public School, New Lambton South Public School, Tamworth Public School and Tamworth South Public School. Applications will be available online from April 26 2016.

### PLEASE SUPPORT OUR UNIFORM

Parents are reminded that Term 2 is officially winter uniform for all students.

Boys Winter uniform: Blue school shirt, long sleeves and grey trousers with a plain navy jumper / jacket or the SPS tracksuit jacket.

Girls Winter Uniform: Girls have a choice between navy trousers or a skirt with a white blouse. Junior Girls Years K – 2 wear a pinafore with navy tights.

Girls also wear a plain navy jumper / jacket or the SPS tracksuit jacket.
