HUNTER ATHLETICS CHAMPIONSHIPS

Congratulations to our Athletics team who competed in the Hunter Athletics Championships in Glendale, last Friday. The weather was not the best with rain falling for most of the day, but all our students tried their best.

Some of the outstanding results included our Senior Girls Relay coming first with an amazing time of 57.07 seconds. Our Junior Boys Relay also performed well coming in 4th place. Jonah (3/4 HB) come 4th only by 0.01 of a second in the Junior Boys 200m. Ellie (5M) was placed 4th in the 11 Year Girls 800m and 5th in the 11 Year Girls 100m final. Immogen (4R) came 4th in the 10 Year Girls 100m final. Cooper (6P) was 3rd in the 13 Year Boys 100m. In the 12 Year Girls 100m final Layla (6S) was placed 6th and Havanah (6P) was placed 7th. 
IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT OUR HILL STREET PICK UP DROP OFF ZONE

Using the Pick Up Drop Off Area

To use the Pick Up Drop Off area safely we ask that you:

- Must use the area like a quick moving taxi rank
- Need to move forward in the queue of vehicles to the designated area
- Can get out of your vehicle to quickly help your children get in and out safely, however you must not walk away from your vehicle
- Are only allowed two minutes in the signed area (if you take any longer you can be fined) if your children
 are not ready to get straight into your vehicle at pick-up time, you will need to drive round the block and
 queue to enter the area again
- If there are no spare spots in the Pick Up Drop Off Zone you cannot stop at the crossing or obstruct traffic, you must continue to drive on and around the block and try again.
- Should only let your children out once you have pulled into the signed area (it is dangerous to let them out while waiting in a queue)
- Should teach your children to look out for your vehicle and to get in quickly when you pull up

It would help staff if the surname of your child was written in bold and placed in the front windscreen on the passenger's side of the car. It is very difficult to see into cars to identify who is picking up. The below diagram demonstrates the procedure when picking up your child.



Safety Traffic Rules for the Pick Up Drop Off Area

We have been very concerned about safety issues in Hill Street in the afternoon during Pick Up time. Some behaviours of concern are:

- Obstructing the flow of traffic by stopping in a queue at the pedestrian crossing.
- Overtaking cars that are in a queue on the pedestrian crossing.
- Doing U-turns in school zones or from the Pick Up Drop Off area.
- Cars stopping in the bus zone and calling children to their car in front of buses.
- Pulling in front of cars that are already in the Pick Up Drop Off area.

Police have been patrolling this area and issuing fines. Compliance officers from UHSC have also been in attendance. Please make yourself aware of the rules for school zones and pick up zones to avoid fines and demerit points.


SCHOOL CROSSING
